<p>The aircraft commander and observer of C-47 aircraft 4396 reported the following observations:</p> <p>At 000600Z hours a greenish blue pulsating light similar to an exhaust flame was observed for two minutes duration. They estimated it to be approximately two feet in diameter and moving at a speed exceeding 300 M.P.H. in the opposite direction of their aircraft, roughly paralleling its flight path at a distance of twenty-five miles. The object was following a magnetic heading of 240° and the heading of the object was estimated to be between 70° and 80° magnetic heading. The altitude of the C-47 was 14,000 feet and the altitude of the object appeared to be between 18 and 20 thousand feet. The weather was GRSV with no moon. The location of the observation was 50 miles east of Winslow, Arizona in the vicinity of Mallbrook.</p> <p>The pilot contacted the ASA station at Winslow and reported the observation. He added back that their radar equipment was unable to track the unidentified object. After a short radio silence the station again contacted the pilot and stated that the ASA station at Sedona reported the same observation.</p> <p>The aircraft commander was 1st Colonel James R. Jones Jr., 2d Lt., 2nd Bomb Wing, and the observer was Major George Spence, 4th Lt., 2nd Bomb Wing.</p>
